Congratulations to Roberta Rowland-Raybold. In Christopher Cook's article, Fallback Position, in the November issue of TAO, page 48, he praises Roberta's new publication *Winter Solstice: Carols for Organ*. Johanna Masters wrote to me to point out the article and to tell me that she now owns the collection and thinks it is "really wonderful". She will be playing several selections from it for Advent and Christmas. Check with Roberta to find out if there is still time to get the collection before Christmas.

Congratulations to Jean Henssler who performed Sigfrid Karg-Elert's Chorale Improvisation on In Dulci Jubilo on each of the two Madrigal Choir's Lessons and Carols performances this past weekend. The 1941 E. M. Skinner pipe organ at the Church of the Holy Trinity was the perfect organ for Jean's sensitive registrations. This impressive work, though beginning quite innocently, ends with a spectacularly triumphant flourish through which Jean was able to show her impressive musical ability. Also she led the audience of over 200 in three seasonal hymns, using specially selected harmonizations and introductions. Her own introduction to We Three Kings was particularly charming. I must also say that the choir performed admirably.

Note that our chapter's end of the year dinner will not be held until the beginning of the New Year (January 3, 5:00 pm at the Spot Restaurant). Don't wait for January's issue of Mixtures. Go ahead and put it on your calendar as long as you already have it out.


