## Cooperstown “Fun-Day Getaway!”

Saturday, **August 13<sup>th</sup>** -- most important to make your reservation by **July 15<sup>th</sup>** with Ellie Rugg at 692-3204 or jrugg001\*at\*stny\*dot\*rr\*dot\*com.

Below is an outline of the day that may be subject to some changes and additions in the near future through a follow-up email and our website.

Leaving from Lowes’ parking lot on Upper Front St. at **8:30 am**. Please let me know if you would be willing to drive. At this time I will hand out maps, itinerary and directions.

When arriving in Cooperstown, use the Baptist Church parking lot with a fee of \$5.00. Walk from there a block to the **Presbyterian Church** to hear and play its organ. Then from there walk a short distance to **Christ Episcopal Church** to hear the history of the church and the organ.

Lunch at the **Lake Front Restaurant** at 12:30—we can leave our cars here and board the **Glimmerglass Queen** at 2:45 on site for the 40-45 minute boat ride. (\$15)

After the boat ride, there will be free time. The only hitch to this is that several of the museums to visit close at 5:00. A few suggestions: Fennimore Art Museum closes at 5 pm, Farmers Museum closes at 5 pm, Baseball Hall of Fame closes at 9 pm. Wonderful Hyde Hall has tours on the hour from 1-4pm—so this would eliminate the boat ride if you would like to take this tour. And of course, there is shopping and just driving around this gorgeous town.

I would encourage all to investigate Cooperstown on the Internet—lots of info there.
