APRIL A BUSY MONTH FOR BINGHAMTON AGO

Dr. Carla Edwards of DePauw University and Dr. Jonathan Biggers, who met years ago as undergraduate music majors at the University of Alabama, were reunited in a combination master class/recital presented by Dr. Edwards at Binghamton University and at United Presbyterian Church. The two events on April 14-15 were co-sponsored by BU and the Binghamton AGO chapter.

In the master class three students of Dr. Biggers played for Dr. Edwards on the two-manual Wolff organ in the BU Fine Arts Building. Organ major Mark Rossnagel played two Bach chorale preludes from his upcoming senior recital program, and organ students, Denise Aquino and Priscilla Kung played hymns. Afterwards the students, along with those attending the event, commended Dr. Edwards for her helpful instruction and insights.

The next afternoon Dr. Edwards performed a magnificent recital on the 1996 three-manual Guilbault-Therian organ at United Presbyterian Church in Binghamton. Her program began with the rousing *Festive Proclamation* of Samuel Adler and ended with Durufle's *Prelude and Fugue on the Name of Alain*. Music of Bach, Distler, Sokola, near, and Reger filled out the program.

On April 23 several members of the Binghamton Chapter traveled to Cortland, NY and joined about 200 others to hear a delightful 4-hand, 4-feet recital of duo organists, Diane Ames and Paulette Fry at United Presbyterian Church of Cortland. The program included arrangements of Wagner's *Ride of the Valkyries*, Rossini's *Barber of Seville Overture*, and Paulette Fry's own arrangement of *When the Saints Go Marching In*. The 1970 3-manual Wicks Organ in the rear balcony was projected on a screen at the front of the sanctuary. It added to the audience's enjoyment to be able to observe the hands and feet doing their thing. Crossing over or under the hands of the other player is tricky enough. Doing it with the feet is an even greater challenge.


